A contemporary, architecturally striking riverside development in the heart of a vibrant community in the historic Isle of Dogs on the edge of the City, New Union Wharf is where the old traditions of the East End meets its exciting creative future.

The five eye-catching towers are nestled into one of the most impressive meanders of this historic river, looking across the sparkling water of the Thames to the O2 arena and just a short walk from Canary Wharf.

An imposing local landmark in one of the capital's most characterful and unique riverside locations, surrounded by renowned restaurants, bars and tranquil parks, this collection of one, two & three bedroom homes bring the best of young urban living in a burgeoning new neighbourhood to feel part of.

Designed with the community in mind, Architects Jestico + Whiles have created a pattern of terraces and blocks around wide streets, landscaped gardens, and inner courtyards that nod to the old East End. Conceived around the principles of modernism, with floor to ceiling windows and carefully imagined interiors, these are apartments that stand out from the crowd.

And with views across the Thames and direct access to the riverside walk, these homes really do make the best of their setting. So enjoy the relaxing backdrop and feel the buzz of this lively waterside community.


Around the atmospheric old streets of your neighbourhood, casual pubs and cafés sit on quiet Victorian streets. Housed in the eves of a former chapel, Hubbub is a buzzy café and arts centre with an exhibition space and strong community feel.

One of the most evocative streets is Coldharbour, home to The Gun, a cosy gastropub where riverside views complement one of the best Sunday Roasts in East London. Also, try The George; a traditional East End pub that even serves Pie & Mash.

When it comes to relaxing there are plenty of options, some might even surprise you. Set in over 30 acres of countryside, Mudchute Park is an oasis of green space that even has a working farm with rare breed animals, adjoining stables and equestrian centre. To the west of New Union Wharf with lovely views across the river, Sir John McDougall Gardens is the perfect picnic spot after a walk along the Thames Path.

And with supermarkets such as Tesco, Asda and Co-op alongside the local stores like The Flower Shop, you will soon settle into your new neighbourhood.

Time to explore


New Union Wharf is perfectly placed for you to enjoy the buzzy waterside neighbourhoods of this historic area of London.

Michelin-star restaurants around the atmospheric docks and relaxed shopping squares, Canary Wharf is much more than a centre for business.

For a sophisticated night out there's Roka, specialists in wood fired North Japanese small plates or Iberica, where Chef Nacho Manzano from the Michelin starred Casa Marcial in Asturias, creates modern interpretations on classic Spanish dishes. Canary Wharf is also known for its stylish steak houses like Goodmans on South Quay with chef selected cuts dry-aged onsite. Also making the best of the dockside setting are relaxed yet lively eateries like Wahaca and Big Easy specialists in American B.B.Q.

Best known for the O2 Arena, the new creative neighbourhood of Greenwich Peninsula is also home to riverside sculpture walks, art galleries, and Wayward an award-winning collective of designers, artists and urban gardeners. Along the waterfront from here is the historic centre of Greenwich home of the Cutty Sark, Royal Observatory, and the famous market.








