## Key information about the home

There are variations of shared ownership models which have different features. The model of shared ownership may vary depending on:

- what rules were in place at the time the home was funded or planning permission granted
- where the home is located
- whether the home is for a specific group of people

The table below highlights the key features of common shared ownership schemes. The information in this document is for the new model shared ownership.

When you are looking for shared ownership homes, you should always check the Key Information Document to see which model covers that specific home.

When you buy a home through shared ownership, you enter into a shared ownership lease. The lease is a legal agreement between you (the 'leaseholder') and the landlord. It sets out the rights and responsibilities of both parties.

Before committing to buy a shared ownership property, you should take independent legal and financial advice.

This key information document is to help you decide if shared ownership is right for you. You should read this document carefully so that you understand what you are buying, and then keep it safe for future reference. This document 'Key information about the home' is a summary and you should consider the
information in ‘Summary of costs' and ‘Guide to shared ownership’ before making a decision.

This does not form part of the lease. You should carefully consider the information and the accompanying lease and discuss any issues with your legal adviser before signing the lease.

Failure to pay your rent, service charge, or mortgage could mean your home is at risk of repossession.

The costs in this document are the costs as at the date issued. These will increase (typically on an annual basis) and you should take financial advice on whether this will be sustainable for you.

| Reservation fee | €250 <br> You'll need to pay a reservation fee to secure your home. When you pay the fee, no one else will be able to reserve the home. <br> If you buy the home, the fee will be taken off the final amount you pay on completion. If you do not buy the home, the fee is not refundable. |


| Eligibility | You can apply to buy the home if both of the following apply: <br> - your household income is $£ 80,000$ or less <br> - you cannot afford all of the deposit and mortgage payments to buy a home that meets your needs <br> One of the following must also be true: <br> - you're a first-time buyer <br> - you used to own a home but cannot afford to buy one now <br> - you're forming a new household - for example, after a relationship breakdown <br> - you're an existing shared owner, and you want to move <br> - you own a home and want to move but cannot afford a new home for your needs <br> If you own a home, you must have completed the sale of the home on or before the date you complete your shared ownership purchase. <br> As part of your application, your finances and credit history will be assessed to ensure that you can afford and sustain the rental and mortgage payments. <br> Also, you must have a local connection to East Hants District Council either through residency, work or family. |

| Rent Review | Your rent will be reviewed each year by a set formula using the Retail Prices Index (RPI) plus 0.5\%. <br> For more information, see the Rent Review section in the 'Summary of Costs' document which includes an example of how rent could increase over a 5 year period. A worked example demonstrating how the rent is calculated at review is also set out in Appendix 2 of the lease. |
| Maximum share you can own | You can buy up to 100\% of your home. |


| Transfer of freehold | At 100\% ownership, the leasehold title remains in your name <br> but your shared ownership obligations fall away. |
